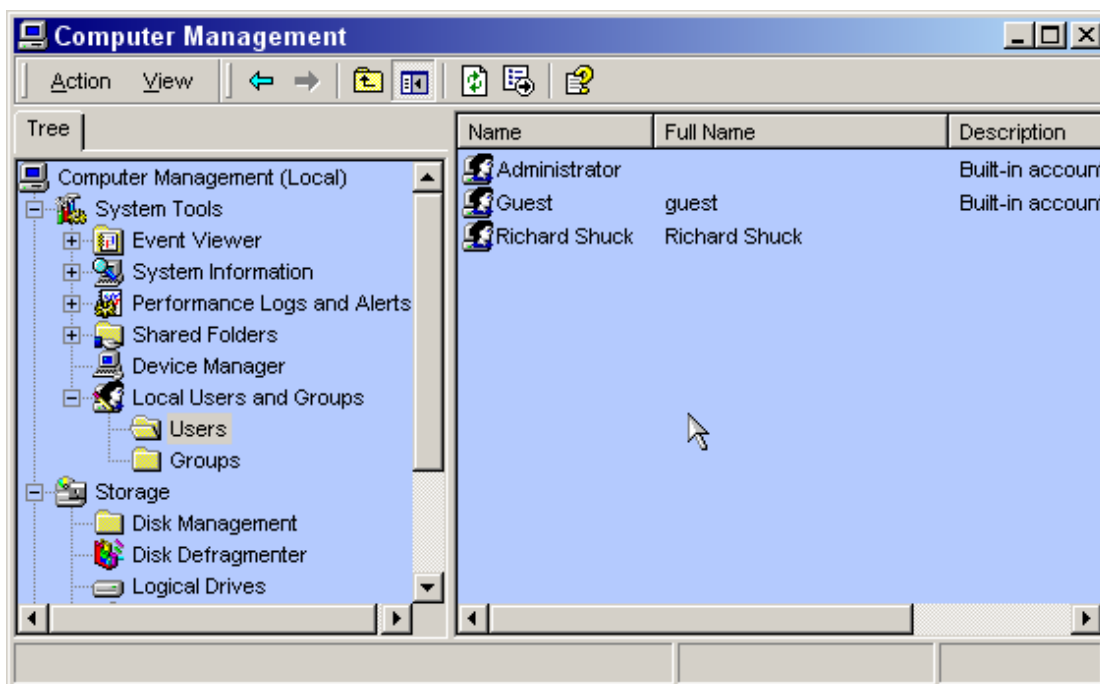


This tutorial will demonstrate the process enabling non-administrator users to run MiniPOS or MiniPOS Till in Windows NT/2000/XP Pro. The steps require you to be logged in to Windows with administrator rights and have no other applications running as they may be affected.

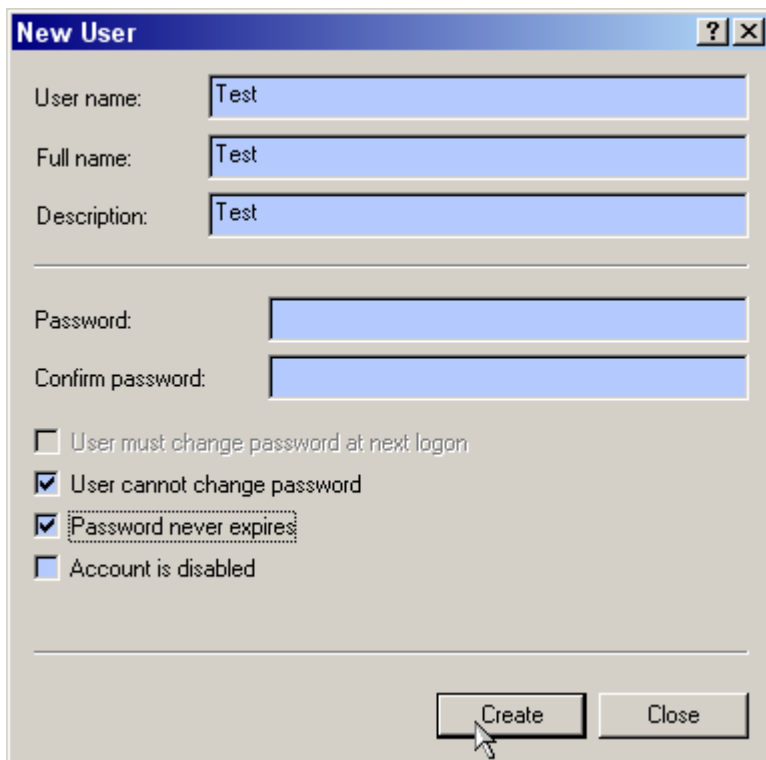
Firstly we will create a non-administrator user that we want to have rights.

Click Start\Programs\Administrative Tools\Computer Management to open up the window below.

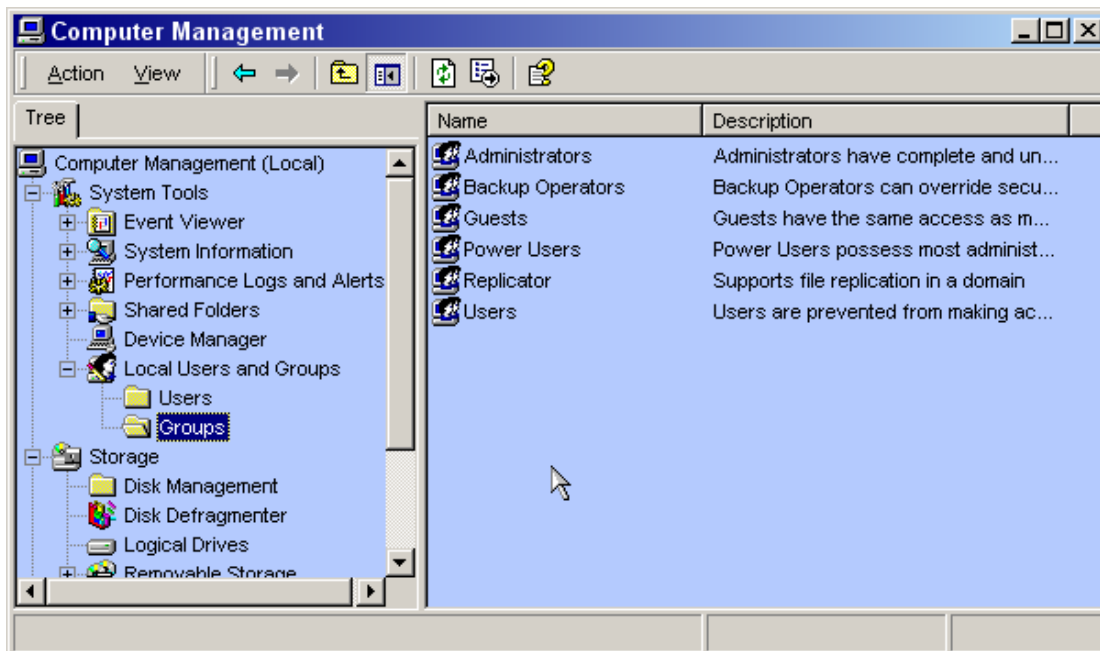
Highlight 'Users' on the left and then right click in the blank space below the users shown on the right. Select 'New User'.



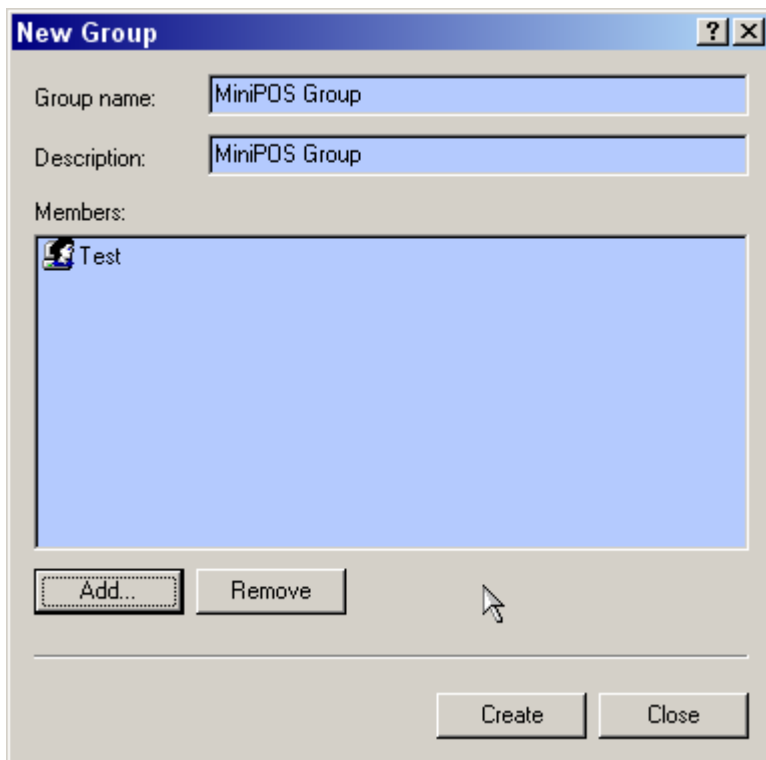
Fill out the form that appears as shown below. The actual specific details like user name can be of your choosing but it is best at this stage to follow the process through once as shown here.



After filling out the details click 'create' and then 'close'. Once you have returned to the main Computer Management window highlight 'Groups' in the left pane and right click in the blank space below the groups to get the popup menu up again.



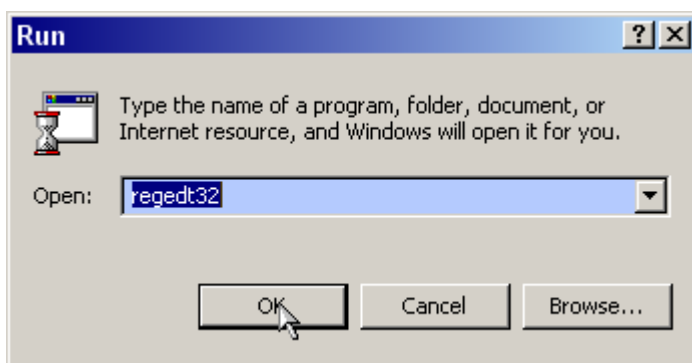
Select 'New Group' from the popup menu to open the window shown and enter the details as shown below. Add the newly created user to be a member of this new group by clicking 'Add' and then click 'Create' and 'Close' to return to the main window and finally close the main window.



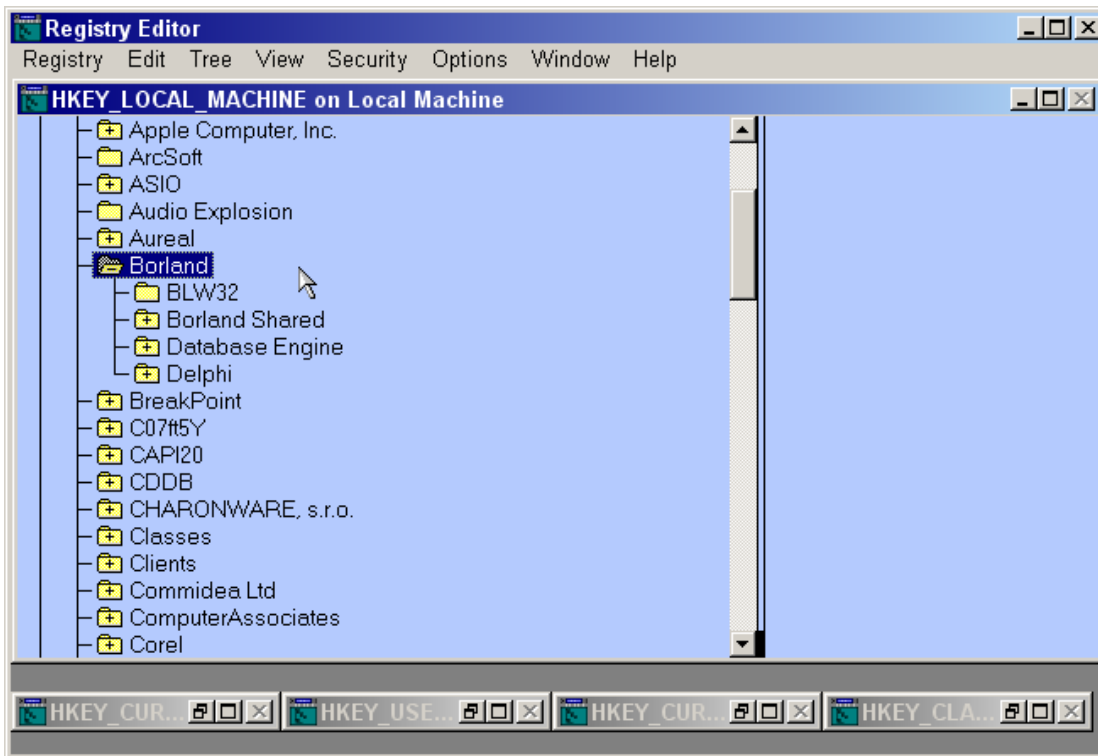
So now we have a new user called 'Test' who is a member of the user group 'MiniPOS Group'. We will now apply new security settings on the group so later we can add as many users to the group as we like without modifying security settings again.

To set up security we have to run regedt32 which is only available on NT based systems (NT/2000/XP Pro) and should not be confused with regedit.

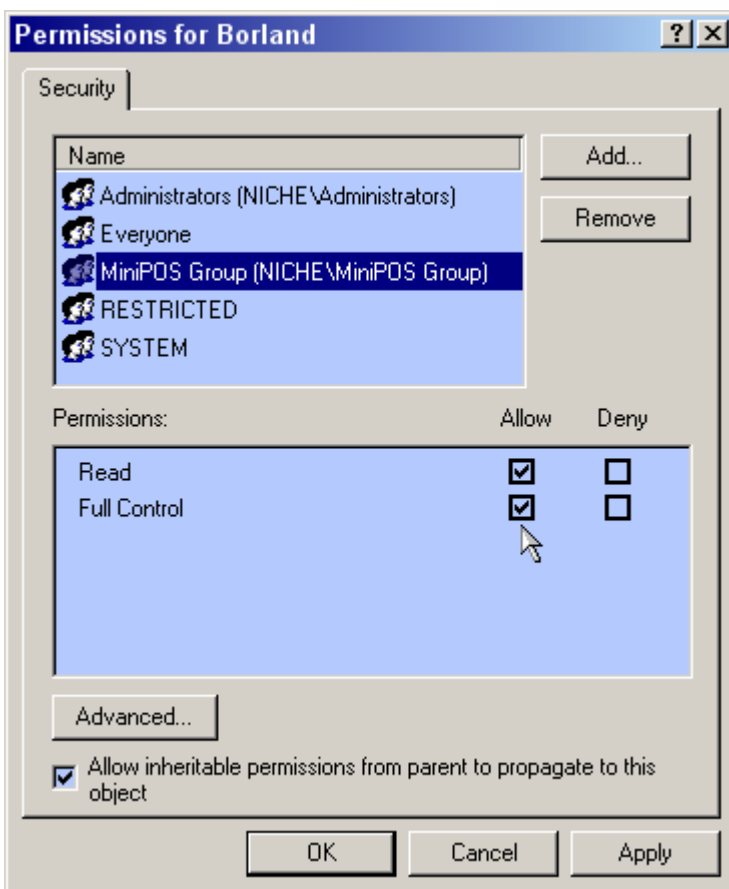
Click Start\Run, enter 'regedt32' into the program name box and click 'Ok'.



Once the window appears you must select the smaller window titled 'HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE' and bring it to the foreground. If you are unable to locate the window you can click 'Window' on the main menu bar and select it from there. Now you must navigate using the scrollbars and clicking on the plus signs next to the groups of settings to find HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Borland as shown below. Once the group 'Borland' is highlighted in blue click 'Security' on the main menu bar and then click 'Permissions'.

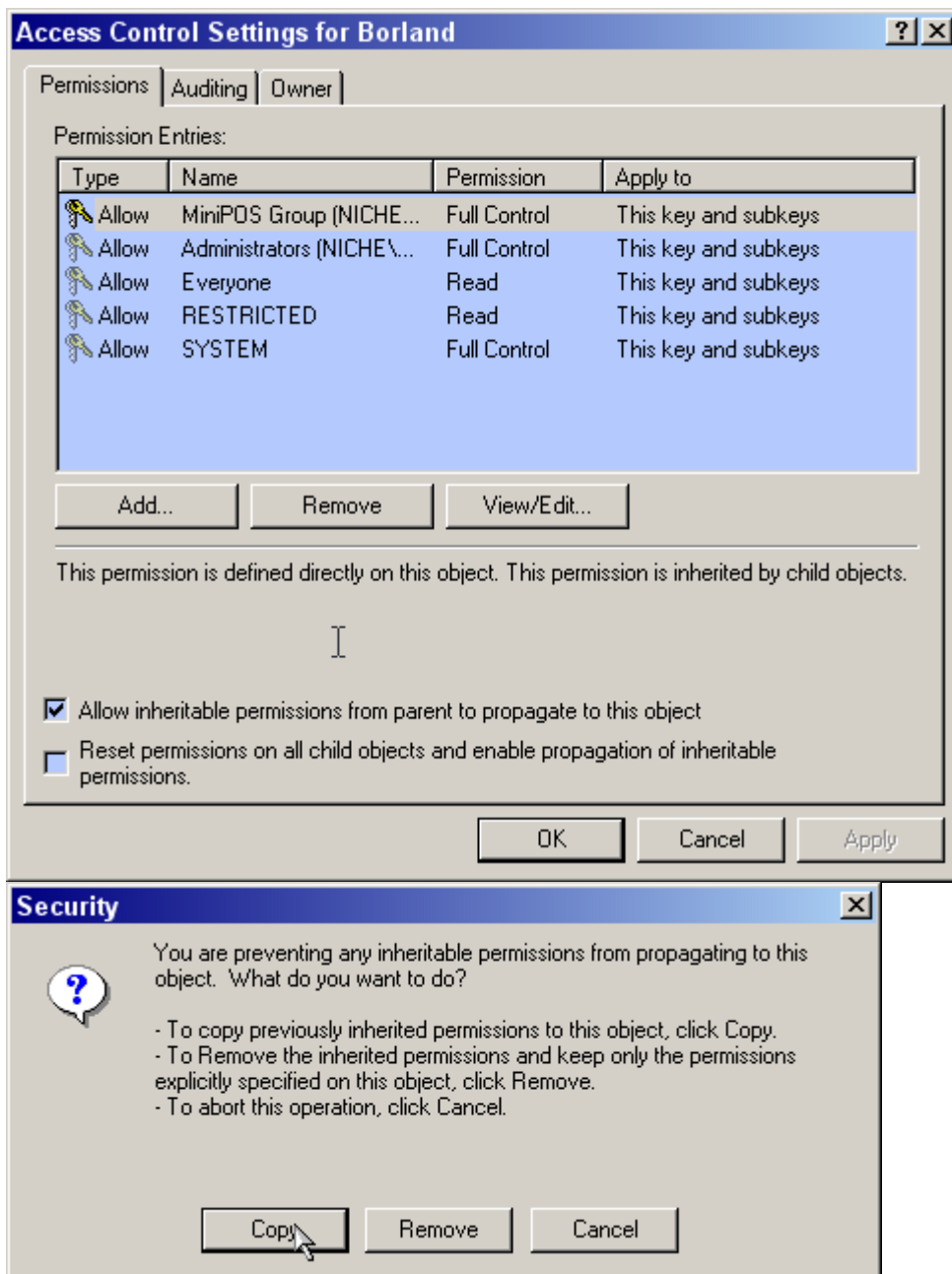


Click 'Add', find 'MiniPOS Group' in the list and add it and when you return to the screen below you should see 'MiniPOS Group' in the list. Click once on 'MiniPOS Group' to highlight it and then click on 'Allow' in 'Full Control' to put a tick.

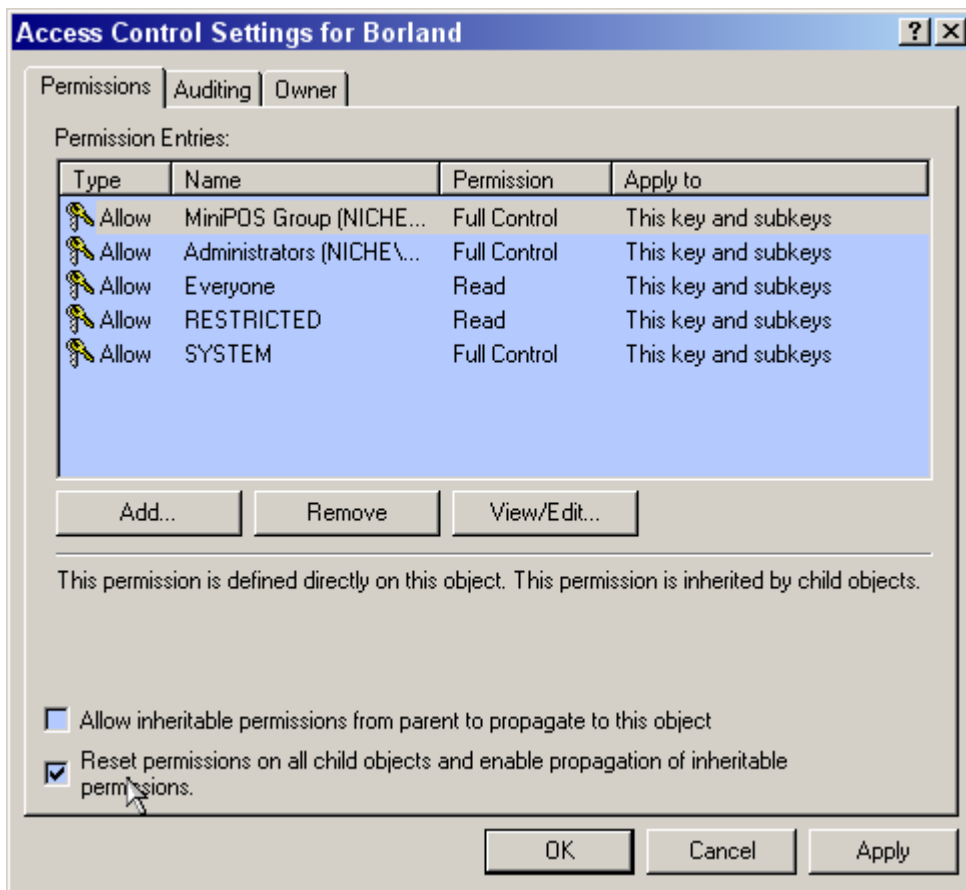


Click the 'Advanced' button to bring up the window shown below.

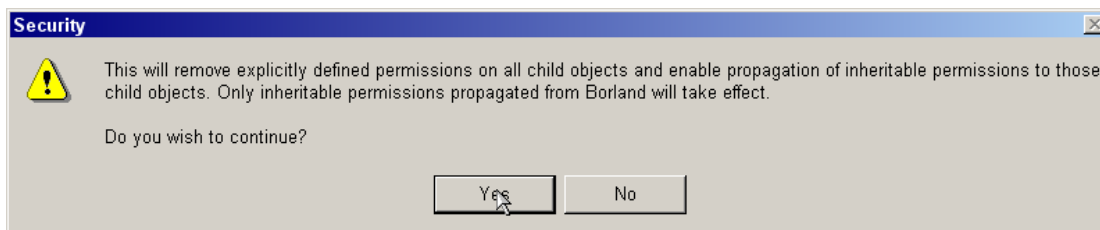
Un-tick the first check box you see to disable inheritable permissions and then click 'Copy' from the warning message which appears.



Tick the check box 'reset permissions on all child objects' and click 'OK'



Click 'Yes' when you see the message below.



Now you should be back at the main screen. The security steps above must be performed once again but for the HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Niche International Limited group.
